FINTRY AMATEUR DRAMATIC SOCIETY TRUSTEES' REPORT

The trustees submit their report and accounts for the year ended 30 April 2024.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Society is an unincorporated association with its own constitution.

The trustees comprise the members of the Society Committee, who are recruited by seeking appropriately experienced volunteers amongst the membership. Committee members are appointed at the Annual General Meeting. The current members of the Committee are listed on page 1.

The management of the Society is carried out entirely by the Committee.

No remuneration was paid to any members of the Committee. Members are reimbursed for expenses incurred, asmany of the Society's expenses have to be paid for immediately by cash or personal card.

Objectives and activities

The principal activity of the Society is to advance the education of the public in the art of drama by the presentation of public performances and other related activities.

This objective is achieved by producing plays on a regular basis, which are performed in local venues.

Achievements and performance

The year kicked off with a youth production, Stampers, which premiered for two nights in Fintry in July before touring to a youth festival in Perth. The Christmas Panto was Aladdin, which played to sell-out audiences over eight performances in November-December. Our entry to the SCDA One-Act Play Festival, Mr Moonlight, unfortunately did not progress past the first round. However, it attracted good audiences when it was performed alongside The Book Club of Little Witherington in our Spring Plays Festival in April.

Committee and AGM

Three office bearers and six ordinary members (including a co-Treasurer) were elected to serve in 2023/2024 at the AGM, held on 11 May 2023.

This year the Club had 34 adult members, 18 juniors/students and 3 primary-aged children.

Financial Review

The results for the year show a profit of £6,987 which increases our funds carried forward to £17,475.

The net income from performances (including bar income) was £10,656 as opposed to £5,578 in 2022/23.

Reserves policy

It is necessary for the Society to hold a sufficient level of reserves to meet expenditure on productions, most of which has to be paid before any income is received from the performances.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT EXAMINER TO THE MEMBERS OF FINTRY AMATEUR DRAMATIC SOCIETY

I report on the accounts for the year ended 30 April 2024 set out on pages 4 and 5.

Respective responsibilities of committee and reporting accountant

As described on page 3, the Committee is responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investments (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The Committee considers that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. Basis of independent examiner's statement
